The **Welsh Language Commissioner** is one of these and the **Commissioner's main vision** is a Wales where people can **use Welsh in their everyday life** and **live their life in Welsh**.





According to the Commissioner:

“ As the **Welsh Language Commissioner**, I work to ensure that the **people of Wales**, including **children**, and **young people** like you, can **enjoy using the Welsh language** every day. I want for **all of us** to be able to **use and speak** Welsh as an **exciting** and **vibrant** language, which **flourishes today** and in the **future**. ”



However, it is important to remember that the **Welsh language belongs to everyone in Wales**, whether we speak it fluently or not. Protecting the Welsh language is not the role of one individual or organisation – **all of us** have a **responsibility to help and play our part**.
